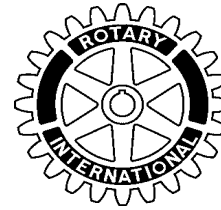

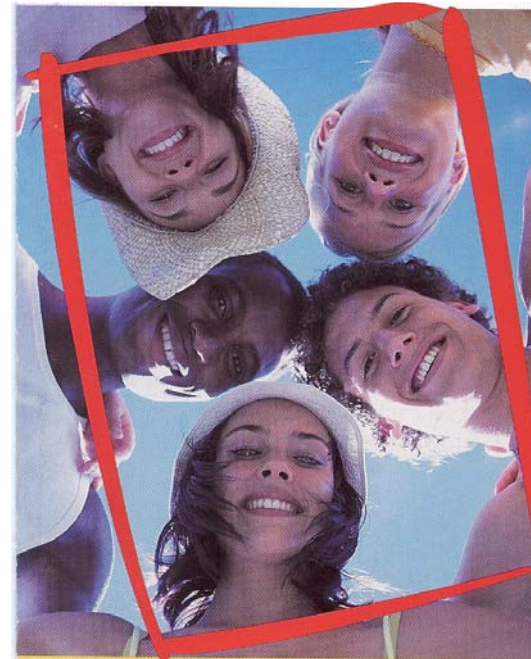

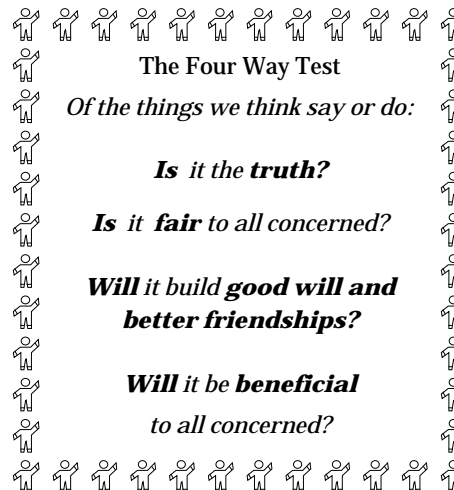

Goals

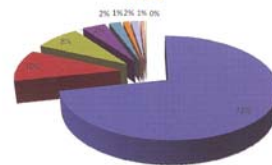
- Vulnerable children are in safe, nurturing, financially stable environments.

Mission Statement

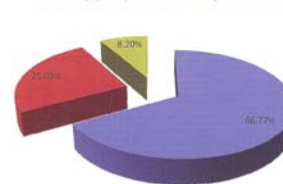
